

Survival Toilet



This is an inexpensive and practical answer to emergency potty needs.

Instructions:

Take a 6 or 5 gallon bucket (6 gallon best for adults) and line the bucket with a trash bag (opaque is best).

Attach the toilet seat. This potty lid is easily purchased for about \$10.

If you do not use a liner in the bucket just dispose of waste as needed, however, you will then need to wash out the bucket.

To absorb moisture put a cup of kitty litter into the waste bag, add more kitty litter as needed for liquid. Tie the bag closed and dispose. Kitty litter and chemicals will allow you to go longer between disposals.

MORE:

You can use RV treatment chemicals and RV toilet paper for quicker breakdown and odor control. Chemicals will allow you to go longer between clean-ups.

Without chemicals you can add wood ashes to the bucket, this will help with smell, promote decay and ashes are available at any campfire.

I fill my potty bucket with supplies and have it ready and stored in my preparedness area for quick access in an emergency. As pictured above I store several rolls of toilet paper, a roll of plastic bags and a plastic jar filled with kitty litter inside the bucket. For Hygiene add a bottle or two of hand sanitizer.

For privacy you can make a tarp enclosure or purchase a shower tent as shown to the right, these are available for less than \$40. Be sure to store this tent with your survival toilet.
